Dans le mode modéré, **Avast** empêchera l'exécution d'un programme qu'il ne connaît pas et vous affichera un message vous demandant ce qu'il doit faire.



0. PREAMBLE

1. APPLICABILITY AND DEFINITIONS

Such a notice grants a world-wide, royalty-free license, unlimited in duration, to use that work under the conditions stated herein. The Document, below, refers to any such manual or work. - M. Delete any section Entitled Endorsements. Such a section may not be included in the Modified Version.
- N. Do not retitle any existing section to be Entitled Endorsements or to conflict in title with any Invariant Section.
- O. Preserve any Warranty Disclaimers.
